Don't forget about our Parish Picnic this Sunday and thank you to all who stepped up to help Brother Bill Morgan.


New officer installation is next month and would like to thank all who stepped up and especially those who have served.

From the Chaplain's Desk

ANCHORED IN HOPE

Greetings my brother Knights,

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

We celebrate Pentecost on Sunday, June 8, this year. This is considered the "birthday" of the Church because it is by the gift of the Spirit that the apostles and disciples of Jesus were able to witness to his life, death and resurrection, the primary duty of the Church. May the Holy Spirit continue to lead us to this witness, to be missionary disciples who share the Gospel with all those we meet.

We also celebrate the recent election of Pope Leo XIV and ask the Holy Spirit to continue to inspire him as he leads the Catholic Church in this missionary witness, evangelization.

As we have been doing these months since the beginning of the Jubilee Year, Pilgrims of Hope, we continue to make our way through Pope Francis' Bull of Indiction, Spes non confundit. The next section entitled "Anchored in Hope" is quite lengthy and so we will cover it over the next few months.

Pope Francis begins by recalling that there are three theological virtues: faith, hope and charity. They are referred to as "theological" because they are given to us directly as gifts from God and are not achieved by our own efforts. The other virtues, though made possible by the God's gift of reason and free will, we are able to arrive at by using these gifts, according to our nature.

The theological virtues, writes Francis, are "the heart of the Christian life". He states:

In their inseparable unity, hope is the virtue that, so to speak, gives inward direction and purpose to the life of believers. For this reason, the Apostle Paul encourages us to "rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, and persevere in prayer" (Rom 12:12). Surely we need to "abound in hope" (cf. Rom 15:13), so that we may bear credible and attractive witness to the faith and love that dwell in our hearts; that our faith may be joyful and our charity enthusiastic; and that each of us may be able to offer a smile, a small gesture of friendship, a kind look, a ready ear, a good deed, in the knowledge that, in the Spirit of Jesus, these can become, for those who receive them, rich seeds of hope.

Hope, then, is meant to make our faith and charity attractive by giving us reason to be "joyful", "enthusiastic", "kind", and "good", which will then inspire others who are not yet followers of Jesus to consider becoming such followers. A question then arises for each of us: Am I all of these things in how I live my Christian life? If not, perhaps my hope is not as strong as it is meant to be.

To strengthen our hope, the Pope then explores the reasons we are hopeful. The first reason is our belief in life everlasting. Hope "that theological virtue by which we desire... eternal life as our happiness" (CCC 1817). So, we "view the passage of time with the certainty that the history of humanity and our own individual history are not doomed to a dead end or a dark abyss, but directed to an encounter with the Lord of glory". We live looking forward to the coming of the Lord Jesus and the final establishment of the Kingdom of God. Our Advent cry is therefore a cry of hope, "Come Lord Jesus", which we express in the hope of this glorious second coming.

The next reason for our hope is what we have celebrated in the Easter Season: the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. This we will consider together next month.
