

From the Chaplain's Desk
SIGNS OF HOPE

Greetings my brother Knights,

As we enter these final days of our Lenten journey in preparation for the celebration of the most important moment in the history of salvation, the passion, death and resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, let us not fail to seek and even deeper relationship with Him who is the source of true life.

Continuing our study of the Bull of Indiction for the Jubilee Year, *Spes Non Confundit*, promulgated by Pope Francis, we are at the section entitled "Signs of Hope". These signs, the Holy Father reminds us, are found in our day to day lives, as stated clearly in the document *Gaudium et spes* of the Second Vatican Council:

In every age, the Church has the **responsibility of reading the signs of the times and interpreting them in the light of the Gospel.** In this way, in language adapted to every generation, she can **respond to people's persistent questions** about the meaning of this present life and of the life to come, and how one is related to the other.

These signs of the times, then says the Pope, need to become signs of hope for all people. He then delineates those various signs. The first sign is the desire for peace. In a world full of conflicts which seem to be unending and often appear to have the upper hand, we believers need to be instruments and signs of hope by a "commitment to seek, with courage and creativity, every opportunity to undertake negotiations aimed at a lasting peace". This is only possible if we truly believe in

the transforming power of prayer and living continually in the presence of God.

"Looking to the future with hope also entails having enthusiasm for life and a readiness to share it." This statement by the Holy Father truly strikes to the heart of a true problem in our world today. Are we truly enthusiastic about life and sharing in life with those around us? The Pope points out that the "alarming" decline in birth rate in many countries would indicate the opposite is the case. Instead, we as believers are called to affirm that:

Openness to life and responsible parenthood is the design that the Creator has implanted in the hearts and bodies of men and women, a mission that the Lord has entrusted to spouses and to their love...Consequently, the Christian community should be at the forefront in pointing out the need for a social covenant to support and foster hope, one that is inclusive and not ideological, working for a future filled with the laughter of babies and children, in order to fill the empty cradles in so many parts of our world... All of us, however, need to recover the joy of living.

After his refreshing call to once again treasure bringing new life into the world, the Pope points out other sections of society which are in desperate need of us being signs of hope for them: prisoners, the sick, the young, migrants, the elderly and the poor. After sharing the various ways we can be signs of hope for these people (and mostly by being with them), the Pope concludes:

May the Christian community always be prepared to defend the rights of those who are most vulnerable, opening wide its doors to welcome them, lest anyone ever be robbed of the hope of a better future.

We are, therefore, challenged to be signs of hope for the most vulnerable and needy by seeking to assist them and to let them know of our love and respect. As Knights, we are called to this as well by our commitment to charity and service. May we always heed this call.


