From the Chaplain's Desk

A Year of Grace with

St Joseph Marello

Greetings my brother Knights,

The month of October is the month of the Holy Rosary. As Knights, we are encouraged to carry the rosary with us at all times ... and to pray it as well! In the vestibule of the church, we have a table dedicated to the rosary and on that table are books and pamphlets to assist in praying it well. One of those books is published by the Oblates of St. Joseph and is entitled, "The Rosary with Mary and Joseph". In this booklet, you can learn how to pray the rosary in such a way as to include the Spouse of the Mother of God and our Holy Patron, St. Joseph. If you have not already done so, be sure to pick up a copy of the booklet and bring the earthly father of Jesus into your meditative praying of the rosary.

As I mentioned at our last meeting, beginning at the end of November this year, the Oblates of St. Joseph will be celebrating a special year of St. Joseph Marello. On November 25, 2026, we will celebrate 25 years since the canonization of Marello by Pope St. John Paul II. To commemorate and celebrate well this anniversary, the OSJ will be having "A Year of Grace with St. Joseph Marello". The year will include various celebrations, reflections and activities seeking to highlight the character and holiness of our parish and council patron. As the St. Joseph Marello Council, we will need to see how we can make this year special as well.

One way I will seek to do this is by sharing a particular virtue of St. Joseph Marello in these monthly bulletin

articles. In this way, we can seek to grow in our faith, hope and charity, the theological virtues, along with all the other virtues which can lead us to be true followers of Jesus Christ. These reflections will begin next month. This month I would like to share with you, briefly, the miracles attributed to St. Joseph Marello which allowed for his beatification in 1993 & his canonization in 2001.

The first miracle happened in the 1940's & involved one of the seminarians of the OSJ. His name was Aldo Falconetti. He was in the formation house in Armeno, in northern Italy, near Lake Como. He had developed a various serious lung ailment, similar to tuberculosis, and the doctor suggested he might not live through the illness. This led his OSJ formators & his formation companions to go to the chapel & seek his cure through the intercession of, at that time, Servant of God, St. Joseph Marello. As they prayed in the chapel, suddenly Aldo himself came to pray with him, completely cured of his ailment as the doctor later attested. The first miracle of St. Joseph Marello had taken place but was not presented as such until the early 1990's to the Vatican. It was authenticated as a true miracle through the intercession of Marello and he was beatified by Pope John Paul II in Asti in September of 1993.

A few years later, another miracle involving a cure from a lung disease was attributed to his intercession, but this one took place in Peru & involved not one but two people, two children. The mother of the two children had been told by the doctor that they might not survive the night & were definitely not going to live much longer if the disease continued unabated. She prayed to God for her children to be cured & during the night had a dream in which a man dressed in a cassock told her that the children would be fine. The next morning, upon awaking, she discovered this to be the case & was grateful to God for their cure. She did not know the identity of the man in her dream until she saw an image of St. Joseph Marello being carried in procession by the faithful of her hometown in the Andes Mountains. Upon seeing his image, she identified him as the man who had to come to her in her dream. The miracle cure was then attributed to the intercession of Blessed Joseph Marello & he was canonized not long after in November of 2001. This miracle was the cure of two for the price of one! God is so good!

May we have the same faith as those friends of Aldo and the mother of the two children as we turn to God in prayer, through the intercession of St. Joseph Marello.
